

Randallstown Senior High School Amateur Radio Club Constitution

I. Purpose

- A. To promote interest of students in the field of radio communications.
- B. To assist interested persons to obtain an FCC license for amateur operations.
- C. To perform a public service as outlined in FCC regulations and the Communications Act of 1934 as amended.
- D. To enhance student's knowledge of foreign countries through direct contact with foreign amateur radio operators.
- E. To provide an opportunity for experimentation and development of operator ability in radio communications.

II. Goals

- A. Assembling an operating station.
- B. Expanding and improving the station.
- C. Training of new amateur radio operators.
- D. Advancement of license class of members.
- E. Performing services such as message traffic handling and phone patching.
- F. Establishing Randallstown Senior High School ARC as an affiliate of the American Radio Relay League.

III. Supervision

- A. All activities will be under the supervision of the faculty adviser.
- B. The club will be licensed by the Federal Communications Commission and will be subject to all rules and regulations of the FCC.

IV. Sources of Equipment

- A. Equipment used will be obtained from club members or local amateur operators.
- B. Equipment may be obtained from local ham outlets or through surplus at nominal cost.

V. Officers

- A. All officers will be elected by a majority vote of the membership.
- B. The President will be responsible to the faculty adviser.
- C. The president assumes responsibility for organization of activity and leadership of meetings.
- D. The Secretary treasurer will handle all correspondence.
- E. The Secretary treasurer will keep all records.

VI. The only qualification for membership is a bona fide interest in the hobby of amateur radio.

VII. Amendments to this Constitution must be approved by a majority vote of the members.

VIII. This Constitution is ratified upon majority vote of the members.
